European Workshop in Macroeconomics

June 25-26, 2010

The University of Munich is hosting the 2010 edition of the European Workshop in Macroeconomics, to be held at the Center for Advanced Studies on June 25 and 26. The organizers are Matthias Doepke (Northwestern), Theo Eicher (University of Washington), Gerhard Illing (Munich), Monika Piazzesi (Stanford), and Martin Schneider (Stanford). The program committee also includes Wouter den Haan (Amsterdam), Monika Merz (Bonn), Salvador Ortigueira (EUI), and Klaus Waelde (Mainz).

The conference is primarily intended for advanced graduate students close to completion of their Ph.D. who would like to benefit from presenting in front of an international audience before entering the job market. Young post-docs are also encouraged to apply.

Theoretical and empirical papers from all areas of macroeconomics are welcome. Examples of topics of interest include: technological change and growth; political economy; asset pricing from a general equilibrium perspective; depressions and crises; dynamics of the income distribution; dynamics of the labor market; international trade and macroeconomics; public finance; and monetary theory and policy. Submission of papers in other related areas is encouraged as well.

All presentations are in plenary sessions and time will be left for informal discussions. Participants are expected to stay both days.
